







Nature recycles her resources. Do you?






I suck food out of decaying plants and animals and return it to the soil.




I give off chemicals that break down rocks and wood.



We break decaying matter into small pieces.




I soften decaying matter, making it easier for nature's recyclers to eat.



We turn small pieces of decaying matter into the basic ingredients found in the soil.




I dig tunnels that let air and water into the ground.

## We can't live in landfills where there is no air.




You can help us by recycling your cans, bottles, plastics and paper . . .
